Parental involvement is vital at Shanti Bhavan. With a 97% high school graduation rate, parents are actively engaged through parent-teacher conferences and regular updates. Monthly or yearly donations cover expenses, and sponsors receive quarterly updates, forming personal connections with the journey they're shaping. ThinkSharp Foundation: A Strong Foundation today for Sharper Minds of tomorrow

Mr. Santosh Phad, a visionary in the field of education, founded the ThinkSharp Foundation (TSF) with a deep understanding of the challenges faced by rural schools due to inadequate facilities. Having experienced the stark contrast between his own rural schooling and the enriched education he received in Mumbai, he resolved to bridge the urban-rural education divide. This marked the inception of TSF in 2011, with the mission to enhance rural education's quality and accessibility, especially since a significant portion of India's population resides in rural areas.

TSF initiated the "StudyMall" program, aimed at transforming rural schools into engaging learning spaces. The first step was upgrading traditional classrooms to e-classrooms, boosting students' participation and comprehension. By improving infrastructure, TSF increased engagement and facilitated better learning experiences.

Step-by-Step Approach and Constant Learning:

TSF's journey from ideation to practical implementation proved to be an enriching experience. Initially focused on e-classrooms, the organization evolved with changing educational needs. Recognizing the importance of computer skills and libraries, TSF established computer labs and modular libraries in schools. Solar cells were installed to ensure uninterrupted power supply, enhancing the quality of education even in areas with inadequate infrastructure. Moreover, TSF addressed sanitation facilities and building upgrades to prevent students from leaving their villages for education.

To ensure long-term sustainability, TSF collaborated with corporations, tech companies, and social enterprises to minimize recurring expenses for schools. These partnerships multiplied TSF's impact, providing software, resources, and expertise. TSF also trained school staff to effectively utilize facilities and technologies, resulting in continued successful engagements.


From a single school to over 250, TSF's scaling success was rooted in meticulous school assessment, infrastructure upgrades, and consistent monitoring. Stringent checks and balances were maintained to ensure that the educational quality and outcomes were consistently met. Leveraging technology in their processes, TSF maximized project impact.


Recognizing the need for qualified educators to harness the benefits of upgraded infrastructure, TSF partnered with "Teach For India" to train fellows in using technology effectively under "TFIx initiative by Teach For India" fellowship. TSF developed outcome-specific activities like coding and library programs, fostering critical thinking and creativity. These initiatives significantly boosted student engagement and learning outcomes, with attendance rising from 80% to 91%, and student feedback improving from 2.5/3 to 4.5/5.







Private Education Sector Numbers











Reforming the Public Education System in India

India's Public Policy Success in Education


Immediately after India's independence only 17% of adults were literate. Schools were available to only 40% of the children in the age groups 6 to 11, and to only 10% in the age groups 11-17. Gender inequity was also high, the percentage of girls attending school in the age group 6 – 11 years was 23.3% in 1950-51. However, the constitutional goal was whole heartedly embraced giving the much needed public policy push to provide free, compulsory education for all up to 14 years. Result, as on date – Academic Year 2022-23 – we have achieved almost 100% enrolment in the primary grades, gender inequity got abolished at that level, and literacy rate is 77%.


Problem Statement - Public Schools Diminished

But as the five year plans progressed and around the time and after, the 12th five-year plan was discontinued in 2014, the presence of private sector in education had been established and the dominance of public sector got gradually eroded. Public schools diminished due to inadequate government budgets, and private schools rushed to occupy the space. Voices came in support of private education that recognised them as equal players in the cause of nation building, to provide education to all though not free. Data just before COVID-19 suggests, almost 44% of students in K-12 education in India were from schools in the private sector, aided or unaided. This has created a manmade inequity where private players focussed on providing education to those who can pay while public schools were grappling with the twin crises of access, and quality.

Growth of Private Education Sector - US\$ 32 Billion Industry

According to the FICCI-ARISE report on Liberalization of India's Private Education Sector, the summary of the market size of the private school sector in India FY2017-18 was, in Rupees Crores 233,532.8, or USD 32.44 billion shown here:

Emerging Educationally Disadvantaged or Backward

Gradually but surely the low public sector expenditure in education since Independence, has handed over the Indian K-12 Education system to the private sector in a platter. Thus a 32-billion-dollar industry was created, directly or indirectly, which enriched the private school owners but resulted in the delivery of poor quality education to the disadvantaged who are not only the students coming out of the public schools but also the students from Budget Private Schools, which have worse educational infrastructure. Poor quality education is one of the key reasons for high drop outs and non-inclusion. Furthermore, the lack of access to quality education reinforces a cycle of limited opportunities and limits the potential for social mobility among marginalized communities.

Triple Crises in K-12 Education

To quote a UN Official in the Transforming Education Summit 2022, "Education confronts a dramatic triple crisis: a crisis of equity and inclusion, as millions are out of school; a crisis of quality, as many of those who are in school are not even learning the basics; and a crisis of relevance, as many educational systems are not equipping the new generations with the values, knowledge, and skills they need to thrive in today's complex world."

Digital Divide Driving a Deep Wedge in India

To quote a Research Note in Feb 2022, from LAARDIS – India's Parliament Library, "Most of rural, remote areas lack facilities indicating a huge digital divide. In other words, about 70 per cent of the country does not have access to internet connectivity and available quality of connectivity is poor. Many households, especially belonging to the lower income groups, do not have smart phones, tablets, desktop computers/laptops even television and radio to connect digitally/electronically."

The Solution

But all is not lost. Through quick paced reforms in public policy on education we can re-establish the dominance of the public school education system. First by taking advantage of the 21st century paradigmatic shifts in AI, Digital access, Broadband ubiquity, mobile phone usage, and secondly through reinforcement of measures such as midday meals, strong school infrastructure, teacher training, vernacular delivery, and focus on quality outcomes of education.

Roll out Pragmatic Reforms in Public Policy on Education

Governments – State and Central – are now actively driving the digital revolution in education through DIKSHA, PM e-VIDYA, SWAYAM – Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) platform, and providing digital assets as well as digital content to K-12 students in government schools. The only way to narrow the digital divide between the rich kids and the disadvantaged students is to ride on the wave of new technology and convert government schools into ready-for-21st century schools besides undertaking other reforms in the supply side of education.

Embrace the 'other' Non-State Actors

Central & State Governments should unleash the potential lying within the non-state actors of the other kind (not the private school managements) namely NGOs, CSR, Volunteers, and Philanthropic impulses in India. Together, this unique alliance will bring changes in educational outcomes and quality by an order of magnitude. In providing free and digital access to educational content to every nook and corner, the efforts of these non-state actors will support the disadvantaged students in K-12 schools.

JEET is an example

There are many NGOs and CSR examples providing support and help to the disadvantaged students in the public schools. Pratham, Azim Premji Foundation, Tata Trusts, Meghshala, Parivaar, Avanti Fellows to name a few. JEET is another example of an alliance of the Indian NGOs in education space trying to provide quality content, FREE for the disadvantaged. JEET – Joint Efforts for Educational Transformation – is aggregating about a million educational videos from the internet, in English and 22 Indian languages. JEET's aggregation efforts are supported by JPM Chase, the world's #1 bank in market cap. The development of a portal and providing free access to the disadvantaged is the next step, and JEET is working hard to tap CSR funds/ grants in the education space.



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
